UUA President Peter Morales responds to shooting at Sikh **Temple:**

August 6, 2012

BOSTON – In response to the tragic shooting at a Sikh temple in Oak Creek, WI, Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA) President the Reverend Peter Morales has released the following statement:

"I am shocked, saddened and appalled at the act of wanton violence at the Sikh temple in Wisconsin. Any killing is terrible. Killings that are apparently aimed at a religious group are especially disturbing. I join all Unitarian Universalists in expressing my compassion and in praying for comfort and healing. We are a nation of many faith traditions. We join people of all faiths in praying for victims and their families.

As we move forward in the weeks and months ahead, we must do more than express compassion. We must reflect on what conditions make repeated acts of deranged violence possible and take action. The killings we keep witnessing in America are symptoms of a culture that is too tolerant of hatred and too reluctant to restrict access to deadly weapons."

You are the director and make a video that helps our Unitarian Universalist values go viral.



About September 30th's Speaker:

A native of Maine, the Rev. Ronald A. Hersom was called as the Minister at the Unitarian Universalist Church of Jacksonville, Florida in August 2010. A graduate of Starr King School for the Ministry in 2007, Rev. Hersom was the 2004 scholar at the Tsubaki Grand Shrine in Mie Prefecture, Japan. Ordained in 2007 into the Unitarian Universalist ministry by First Unitarian Church of Albuquerque, New Mexico, Ron served as Intern there in during the 2006-2007 academic year. He then stayed as the Assistant Minister in Albuquerque until his call to the Jacksonville Church.

A Unitarian Universalist for 25 years, Rev. Hersom's experiences as a teacher, a community organizer, a management consultant, and a fundraiser are part of the work history and skills that he brings to ministry. His ex-



periences in Japan as the 2004 Tsubaki Grand Shrine scholar deepened his commitment to pluralism and his belief that no one faith or tradition has the answer – they all do. Rev. Hersom was the President of the MDD Chapter of the Unitarian Universalist Minister's Association 2009-2010.

Before coming to the Unitarian Universalist Church of Jacksonville, Rev. Hersom was a long time Unitarian Universalist participating in lay leadership in congregations in Maine and Massachusetts. He is a graduate of University of Southern Maine (1972) with a BS in Education, and the University of Southern California (1989) with a Masters in Organizational Systems Management.

He just completed his second trip in 6 years to Transylvania this past summer with members from UUCJ as they visited their Partner church in Bozod and Unitarian heritage sites throughout the region.

A Word From the DLRE Search Committee:

As most of you already know, our former DLRE stepped down from that position effective July 1st and we have been operating by hook or by crook without her since. We thought you might appreciate an update on where we stood on the process of selecting a candidate.

As you may be aware, the position was originally advertised as accepting applications until August 31st. We, the search committee, have interviewed a number of good candidates that have already applied, but we can't move forward until we've crossed the end of the month and are sure no one else would be applying. Once we are into September, we will meet with the Board to give our hiring recommendation and, following that, the Board will extend an actual job offer. So, realistically it could be mid-September before we actually have a new DLRE on staff.

We as a committee have been pleased with the candidates so far and are in the unfortunate position of having to choose one among several good candidates. But although it's too early to even know for sure there won't be another applicant, much less be sure who we would select, we wanted the congregation to know that we feel very confident based on our interviews so far that our next DLRE will be a great asset to BBUUC, whoever he or she turns out to be in the end.
