From Your Director of RELIGIOUS EDUCATION



Ten years ago this month, John and I decided to move to Florida after living in Wisconsin for 23 years. Florida was home, and with aging parents, it was time to be closer than 1,200 miles away. It was hard to leave our friends and the Wisconsin we loved, but it seemed the right thing to do. Jacksonville was our place of choice.

Before moving we checked to see if there were UU churches in Jacksonville – a criterion for relocation. After three decades of being a UU in different parts of the country - chairing boards and committees, working as a UU church administrator, helping create Lake Country UU Church from scratch, and serving on the Central Midwest District's Growth Committee - I had come to consider myself a UU evan-

gelist in many ways. Maybe that's a reflection of my Southern Baptist upbringing, but I knew that involvement in a UU church would be an important part of my new life in Jacksonville. As it turned out, BBUUC was just beginning a search for its first Director of Religious Education. I applied for the job, the church decided to take a chance on me, and the rest, I guess, is history.

The ten years since have gone by quickly. I've worked with ten different Boards of Trustees and RE Committees. The RE Committee Chairs with whom I've worked closely during these years have been particularly supportive, responsible, generous, and skilled; several of them served multiple terms. I'm happy with what we've accomplished together in those years working with kids and adults - particularly establishing Enrichment on Sunday mornings and Wednesday nights for adults, implementing Spirit Play, building our Teen group and broadening their UU experience through summer trips, teaching OWL to 1st - 8th grades, "Transitioning" BBUUC kids at life's milestones, holding the first annual all-church retreat, and planning a church summer day camp which hopefully will begin this summer. I appreciated the Board's confidence when it asked me to facilitate the development of our congregation's Covenant of Right Relations years ago and was so grateful to everyone at BBUUC who was involved in my selection in 2008 as Florida District's Religious Educator of the Year.

The years have been full ones. I've watched children grow up, been gifted with many hugs, made wonderful friends, and been supported in my work for the faith I value so much. However, just like ten years ago, it seems this is the right time for a change. After much thought, I've decided to retire as BBUUC's DRE at the end of this fiscal year, June 30, 2012. I look forward to being a lay UU once again.

My contract requires a three-month notice. However, since I consented to a 3-year salary freeze to help BBUUC project expenses expected with the building, I'm aware that the salary for the next DRE might need to be higher. And since this is the time when next year's budget is being planned, it seems like the best time to let the Board know of my decision. During these last four months, I will continue my normal DRE activities, of course, and intend to spend some additional time getting materials and curricula ready for this transition.

My thanks to the loving community of BBUUC that provided support, encouragement, and assistance over these years.

Guest Speaker to Lead BBUUC's First "Great Decisions" Class

Ethan Domkowski, history teacher and experienced Great Decisions leader, will lead BBUUC's initial Great Decisions program on Thursday, March 15, at 7 pm. Through four once-a-month sessions we will examine world issues via an in-depth discussion format within the framework of our UU purposes and principles. From the eight topics set for Great Decisions discussions in 2012, we will focus on four. The first topic will be "Middle East Realignment."

Great Decisions, a national, non-partisan, grass-roots discussion program, has been around since 1954 and is America's largest discussion program on world affairs. Great Decisions groups meet all over the country, including here in Jacksonville. This will offer our congregation a chance to more deeply explore issues that confront us as people committed to the democratic process and to the goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all.

The resource used for this series of discussions is the Great Decisions Briefing book which can be purchased online at fpa.org/great_decisions/ for those who want their own copy, however, advance reading is not required for these discussion groups. We will have a limited number of Briefing books available to check out at church. There will be free childcare at each program. Please sign the sign-up sheet at church if you know you'll be attending, but walk-ins are very welcome!

The dates for the other programs in this series are April 19, May 17, and June 14.

Our Young Adult Ministry: BBUUYA

Our Young Adult group gives members and friends of our church, that are between the ages of **18-35**, an opportunity to connect with one another outside of the normal Sunday service and participate in a broad range of activities such as: worship, focused discussion, social action, lunches, outings, and many other community-building activities. BBUUYA meets regularly on the 4th Tuesday of the month at 7pm, and also gathers for lunch on the 2nd Sunday after the service. They utilize social media, and are in the process of supporting local campus ministries as well as becoming an Anchor Young Adult ministry with the UUA.
