This is an exploration of human feelings in times of cultural disintegration and how the heart may lead the way to staying true to yourself.

About our Speaker:
Karen was born in Wisconsin and owes a debt of gratitude to her family of origin, relatives, and neighbors for their support and guidance as well as access to Wisconsin lakes and forests every summer for many years. Loving the earth comes from the earth itself, but also from peo-



ple who inhabit it and share it well. School and two aunts deserve credit for guiding Karen to the field of education. Their examples and enjoyment of teaching rubbed off on her and she enjoyed teaching for 30 years.

Karen's immediate family includes her husband Ken, two sons, and four grandchildren. It's a growing group. After retiring, Karen applied to the Meadville-Lombard Unitarian Universalist seminary in Chicago. She studied for two years there. One highlight of that experience was being on the board of the Hyde Park Transitional housing project. It was an interfaith effort of neighborhood churches to house the homeless and mentor them for up to two years. Transitions like this take time, but prove life changing.

Another highlight was becoming a chaplain at the University of Chicago Hospitals. Working in the oncology clinic days and spending Friday nights on call for both the children's and adult ER's as well as any hospital calls, kept me feeling quite fulfilled. Moving to Florida seven years ago led me to BBUUC. It was amazing to be present and see what the people here had created with this building and their hopes for it. At this church I've graciously been welcomed in and particularly enjoy being with small groups who listen to each other and explore issues together. Book groups, history of UU groups, environmental groups, the New Jim Crow group, Cakes for the Queen of Heaven, Faith Like a River, Building the World we Dream About, and Evensong groups. I enjoy teaching in Religious Education, being a team leader for the Interfaith Coalition for Action, Reconciliation and Empowerment called ICARE., and checking in on the Christian UU group from time to time.

I have been asked to share thoughts in the form of sermons and I thank those of you who allow me to

do that. I did take a class from Bill Schultz in seminary to learn how to create a sermon. Seems it just happens, helps me learn something new each time, and I'm so grateful to have people willing to share in this process and give me this avenue to grow with. Faith is a mystery is it not?

Sunday, May 6 from 12:15 until 2:00.



Evensong is a good way to explore personal beliefs and possibilities and a great way to get to know a group of people.


There is no fee for Evensong. To register, please email spiritmoves@bbuuc.org or call Karen at 781-8129.

ICARE (Interfaith Coalition for Action, Reconciliation & Empowerment)

At least 44 BBUUC members and friends attended the ICARE Nehemiah Assembly held Monday, April 23. State Attorney Melissa Nelson and



Sheriff Mike Williams were in attendance along with other public officials. Past and ongoing success stories were celebrated including the Grocery Store and Marketplace for 30 entrepreneurs that is being built near the corner of Myrtle and Moncrief; the now over 80% rate of issuing Civil Citations instead of arresting youths for nonviolent offenses in Duval County; and the new State Law supporting Civil Citations instead of arrests due to advocacy by ICARE and nine sister organizations in other Florida cities. It was also recognized that ICARE has momentarily stopped actively working toward a Homeless Day Resource Center in downtown Jacksonville due to opposition from other homeless service providers and the business community. If the issues of homelessness and housing rise to the surface in House Meetings again, they will be addressed again, most likely from a different angle.

Both State Attorney Nelson and Sheriff Williams made commitments to work with ICARE in developing a new level of data transparency on their websites. Sheriff Williams declined to commit to a \$1,500,000 budget for the Jacksonville Re-Entry Center that helps felons who have served their sentences find a place in society. But he did indicate there will be an increase of \$250,000 in their budget. Sheriff Williams also declined to stop issuing citations that include a fine of \$65 for jay-walking offenses and riding bicycles on the sidewalk. (In poor communities, a \$65 fine can be difficult to pay. If not paid, the person loses their driver's license which leads to other major problems.) Sheriff Williams did agree to conduct a major education campaign related

to Pedestrian Violations and other offenses that are much more commonly enforced in poor and black parts of Jacksonville.

ICARE states it's goal as follows: "We want people to feel protected by the police, not afraid of them. Likewise, we want officers to have strong relationships with the community. Therefore, Jacksonville's Sheriff Office must take responsibility for building trust with the public." This includes increasing access to public information and data as well as changing some of the attitudes toward poor and black communities that appear to be holdovers from an earlier era.

alition of 38 Christian, Jewish, Muslim, Bhai and Unitarian Universalist religious congregations.


The gun shooting in Parkland, Florida has been one of many echoes of life being taken without any regard. Many of us have either been directly affected or we know people who have harmed by gun violence. Everyone has the right to thrive in safety and in love. As just one action towards healing, the Social Action committee will be hosting an arts and crafts workshop on May 27 to make sensory bottles that will be donated to RKG Therapy. RKG Therapy is offering free therapy to the students of Parkland. The Social Action committee will also find a local mental health clinic that we can support our neighbors in Northeast Florida.

Sensory bottles are recycled plastic water bottles that can be filled with items that float and glide. As the contents mix, the holder can focus on the actions in the bottle as a method to self soothe and focus. With the assistance of mental health counselors, the holder can communicate about their pain without feeling direct force from eye contact. We are asking for donations of craft items ad will be collecting until May 13. Please do not donate red items.


