



PRESIDENT'S PEN



In this month's President's Pen, we focus on the fourth source of Unitarian Universalism: Jewish and Christian teachings which call us to respond to God's love by loving our neighbors as ourselves.

This is the only source that I tend to have issues with, regarding the wording.

I have always wondered why there is no mention of Islam, within this source. Judaism, Christianity, and Islam are the Abrahamic faiths that all began in the Middle East. There are plenty of mentions in the Koran that speak to loving our neighbors as ourselves. I imagine that it's omission was unintentional, but this omission speaks volumes to me. In an act of spiritual defiance, and a nod to the winter holiday season, I will use this month's President's Pen to share with you the story of Maryam (Mary) and the birth of Isa (Jesus) as told in the Surat Maryam chapter of the Holy Koran.

She was alone, as she was wont to do, worshiping in the eastern section of the temple. Suddenly, she was startled by a strange presence: a man with whom she was not familiar. "I seek refuge from thee with the Most Gracious," she said, "(Approach me not) if you are conscious of Him!" He sought to calm her by saying, "I am but a messenger of your Lord, (who says,) `I shall bestow upon thee the gift of a son endowed with purity.

This startled her most of all. She replied, in shock: "How can I have a son when no man has ever touched me? - for, never have I been an unchaste woman!" The presence replied: "Thus it is; (but) your Lord says, `This is easy for Me; and (thou shalt have a son,) so that We might make him a symbol unto humanity and an act of grace from Us. And it was a thing decreed (by God)."

And so she conceived the child, withdrawing to a far-off place. And when the pangs of childbirth overtook her, she was driven to sit under the trunk of palm tree, and she exclaimed in anguish: "Oh, would that I had died before this, and had become a thing forgotten, utterly forgotten!" Yet, she had the child,

and she then came back to her people carrying him, who were clearly shocked.

They exclaimed, "Thou hast indeed done an amazing thing!" They continued: "O Sister of Aaron," an honorific title for this heretofore pious woman, "Your father was not a wicked man, nor was thy mother an unchaste woman!" She pointed to her newborn child, whereupon they said: "How can we talk to one who (as yet) is a little boy in the cradle?"

Behold, I am a servant of God. He has vouch-safed unto me revelation and made me a prophet, and made me blessed wherever I may be; and He has enjoined upon me prayer and charity as long as I live, and (has endowed me with) piety towards my mother; and He has not made me haughty or bereft of grace. Hence, peace was upon me on the day when I was born, and (will be upon me) on the day of my death, and on the day when I shall be raised to life (again)!

Amazing, isn't it? There is an uncanny resemblance to the Christian story of the birth of Christ. I always get little goosebumps when I read the story of Maryam and Isa. May you blessed this holiday season; no matter which (non)religious practice you choose.

Trustees Wanted

The Board is seeking to fill two Trustee positions that recently became open. Here is a description of the role:

The Trustees shall keep abreast of the business and programs of the church; participate in meetings of the Board of Directors; and perform such



other functions as assigned by the Board. Trustees shall be elected annually to commence serving July 1st, and shall not be related to one another or any officer by blood, marriage, or domestic partnership. ICARE Justice Ministry

ICARE Community Problems Assembly and Research Kickoff

13 BBUUC Justice Ministry Network members helped pick the new issue for ICARE to address citywide at the Community Problems Assembly on November 14. The top three issues brought up in House Meetings in the 38 ICARE congregations were



Criminal Justice, Youth and Education, and Health and Mental Health. All 353 Network Members present at the Community Problems Assembly voted after hearing testimonies for each issue. BBUUC Network Members cast 10 votes for Criminal Justice and 3 votes for Health and Mental Health. Criminal Justice won by a landslide.

The next step is to refine the issue at the Research Kickoff on December 5, 6:30 PM, at Arlington Congregational Church, 431 University Blvd N, Jacksonville, 32211. ICARE members citywide have experienced many situations where police actions are difficult to understand or accept. Cases brought up at the Community Problems Assembly included one where police officers called to help calm down a mentally unstable ex-husband ended with the death of the man by choke hold. He was a veteran, likely with PSTD, and he was unarmed. Other cases included extremely disrespectful treatment during traffic stops and in other encounters involving white police officers and African-American citizens.

Is better training the answer? Better supervision? Pro-active community relations efforts? What positive change can a coalition of 38 religious congregations representing 30,000 members hope to accomplish? What can/should we ask for, and from whom? That will be the topic of conversation for everyone at the Research Kickoff on December 5.

Meals on Wheels Update (Donation Collected Dec. 3)

About Clay County Meals on Wheels:

Home Delivered Meals and nutrition education are provided to elderly who have a physical or mental disability and are homebound, living alone, or with others who need help in the preparation of meals. Outreach is provided to the community for identifying persons in need of service through health fairs, speaking engagements and referrals.

The home delivered meals program provides 1/3 of the recommended dietary allowance requirements for persons over 60 years of age. Meals are packaged in special containers to preserve freshness and maintain food quality. Nutrition education information is provided on a monthly basis.

This "meals-on-wheels" program relies heavily upon volunteers to deliver meals. Private citizens donate their time and vehicles, assisting in the delivery of homebound meals for these isolated citizens. Voluntary contributions towards the cost of meals are encouraged and all contributions are used to purchase more meals.
